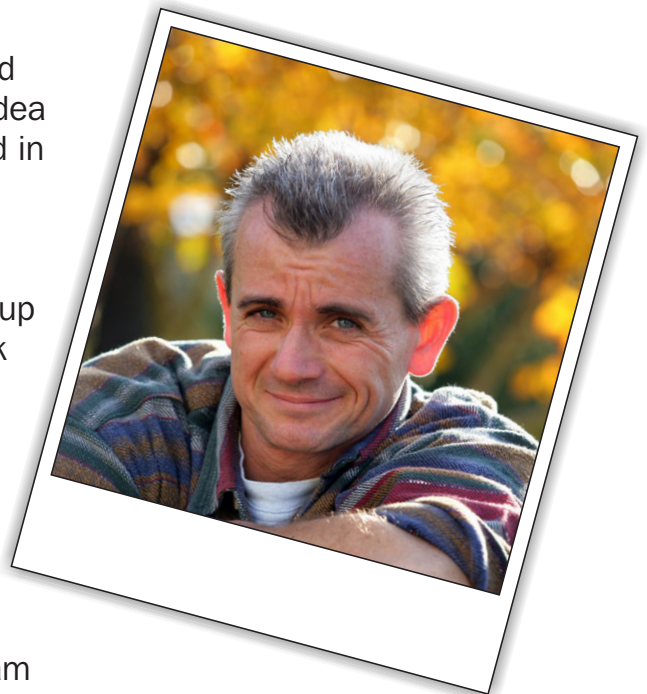

 I was hired at a feedlot and worked my way up to the feedlot manager position. I attend livestock sales and buy and sell livestock. I determine the optimal feed ration for the animals during the different seasons. I'm responsible for herd health programs, monitoring animals for disease, and treating disease problems as they arise. I ensure that health and safety standards are observed and that the feedlot is clean, tidy,

and hygienic. I am responsible for the security of company assets, including land, livestock, and inventories.



 I work with the general manager to prepare short- and long-term operational plans for the feedlot. I prepare budgets, keep financial records, and report on operational and capital expenditures. I manage allocated funds. I hire, supervise, and evaluate workers. I direct the repair and maintenance of equipment and structures, such as livestock watering facilities, yards, buildings, etc.

 Looking back, I think that the decisions I made while still in high school gave me a head start towards the career of my choice. My job is great, and I really like the people I work with.
